*For the listening assessment task, the first of these domains is our focus. This assessment task focuses on understanding and analysis. It is about demonstrating your **understanding** of what you hear; and providing your **commentary** coherently. Marking will not be based on grammar or spelling, provided the expression is understandable for a native speaker of the target language. However, you will receive some advice about your written expression that may be useful to you for the writing tests.*

The structure of the test

*For the audio/video clips in the test, there will be a selection of subjects taken from those listed below. You will need to respond to questions about several audio/video documents. The aim will be to demonstrate your **understanding** of these and to **comment** on them. No notes will be allowed. However, if there are expressions outside of those you might reasonably be expected to know, these will be explained in the test paper.*

Preparation

You should review the resources used during the lessons over the first five weeks of the semester. For each week, in the weekly modules, you have a summary of the information and activities that form part of the program. There are also copies on the class portal on Google Classroom. Theme
